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

VI. OTHER NOTES

1. EXPECTATIONS:

-Class Participation is supremely important
-Attendance is pertinent to class participation
-Notes should be taken and cyber campus materials examined
(should be reviewed following class and studied for exams)

2. ABSENCES: all absences to be excused, must be cleared with the instructor, IN ADVANCE through email. If due to unexpected illness, then a doctor's note will be required by the returning class. There will be no make-up of the Exams, except for extreme illness. Every unexcused Absence will lower you final grade. The instructor will follow the maximum absence "FAIL" as required by Ewha.

3. TARDINESS: Coming in late is taken as seriously as Absence. Every Tardy instance will effect your final grade, both in the number of events, and in the amount of minutes late.

4. STUDENT PRESENTATIONS are small groups (3-4 people) lectures on selected topicsstudents will form into groups and pick a piece relative to the course's material. Every student will speak.

5. CLASS PARTICIPATION is graded subjectively on involvement and progress of student during in-class discussions.

6. EXTRA CREDIT: up to 10% (see professor if interested.)

7. GRADING: Note that Ewha limits the number of given grades, thus the final percentages are "curved" by these restrictions.

8. PLAGIARISM/CHEATING will be seriously dealt with following the rules and regulations of Ewha Womans University.

9. this is an official "English-only" course. The professor understands very 조금 한국어, but can "recognize" and even type in 한글. Whether in or out of class, all matters, including lectures, discussions, conversations, presentations, and correspondences, etc. are to be done in English. However, the professor prefers that you primarily write your name in 한 글, as that allows for proper pronunciation and avoids the numerous romanization confusions.
